President Lewicki announced that the Board would go into a closed session for the expulsion of SDA 11/12-13.

President Lewicki acted as Hearing Officer.

Motion by Vice President Hall and seconded by Mr. Gilbert that the Board go into closed session for the expulsion of SDA 11/12-13. Motion carried.

Motion by Vice President Hall and seconded by Mr. Gilbert that the Board come out of closed session and return to special session. Motion carried.

Superintendent Renzella's recommendation to the Board is that SDA 11/12-13 be expelled from Cameron High School for a period not less than 12 consecutive months.

Motion by Mrs. Kestner, seconded by Mr. Gilbert, and motion carried that the Board will uphold the Superintendent's recommendation to expel SDA 11/12-13 from Cameron High School for a period not less than 12 consecutive months.
